


Pet Program



Message from the Executive Director & Board President

The 2020-2021 year at Interval House of Ottawa will always be remembered as the year of COVID-19. The pandemic challenged us in unprecedented ways. It impacted our clients, employees, volunteers and community in ways that we never could have imagined. It also created opportunities to grow, partner with other organizations and embrace technology in ways that would have taken years rather than weeks or months.

IHO rose to the challenges presented by COVID-19. One month after the lockdown began, in partnership with 5 local community partners, we launched a new text and chat service, Unsafe at Home Ottawa, to offer a safe and discreet way for victims/survivors of violence to reach out for help while isolating at home with abusive partners. Within 2 months of the first lockdown IHO partnered with a local landlord to offer furnished apartments to victims/survivors of violence in need of safe space and developed an isolation protocol with the City of Ottawa. Eight months into the pandemic IHO purchased a new facility to provide 8 additional beds for women and their dependents to access safe space. Over the course of the year we provided food baskets, grocery gift cards and technology to over 150 women and children. COVID-19 highlighted pre-existing inequities in our community; lack of safe shelter, affordable housing, income and food insecurity. IHO worked, in collaboration with many community partners and funders, to address these inequities and offer solutions to the many problems exacerbated by COVID-19.

We could not have accomplished all of this without the incredible support received by community partners, funders, donors new and old and the many local businesses who stepped in to offer support at a time of great need.

With your help, IHO provided safe shelter to 82 women, 87 dependents and 12 pets. We provided support to 188 community service users, 2042 crisis calls on our 24-hour phone line and over 1400 texts and chats on Unsafe at Home Ottawa. Thank you for enabling us to advocate for, support, and empower women and children in need.
